Bear Adventures:

Roaring Laughter

1. Think about what makes you laugh. Write down three things that make you laugh.
2. Practice reading tongue twisters.
3. Create your own short story. Remove some nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs from the story, leaving blanks. Without telling the story, have a friend insert his or her own nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs in the story you created. (Home assignment)
4. With a partner, play a game that makes you laugh.
5. Share a few jokes with a couple of friends to make them laugh.
6. Practice at least two run-ons with your den, and perform them at a pack meeting or campfire program.

Webelos /Arrow of Light Adventures:

2. Show what to do for the hurry cases of first aid: serious bleeding, heart attack or sudden cardiac arrest, stopped breathing, stroke, poisoning.

Building a Better World (5th grade Webelos)

6. Learn about energy use in your community and in other parts of our world. (Home assignment)

Scouting Adventure (5th grade Webelos)

1a. Prepare yourself to become a Boy Scout by completing all of the items: Repeat from memory the Scout Oath, Scout Law, Scout motto and Scout slogan..

1b. Explain what Scout spirit is.

1c. Give the Boy Scout sign, salute and handshake.

2. Visit a Boy Scout troop meeting with your parent or guardian. After the meeting, do the following:

2a. Describe how the Scouts in the troop provide its leadership.

2b. Describe the four steps of advancement.

2c. Describe ranks in Boy Scouting and how they are earned.

2d. Describe what merit badges are and how they are earned. (partial home assignment)

3. Practice the patrol method in your den for one month by doing the following:

3a. Explain the patrol method. Describe the types of patrols that might be part of a Boy Scout troop.

3b. Hold an election to choose the patrol leader.

3c. Develop a patrol name and emblem, as well as a patrol flag and yell. Explain how a patrol name, emblem, flag, and yell create patrol spirit.

3d. As a patrol, make plans to participate in a Boy Scout troops campout or other outdoor activity.
(Home assignment)

Elective –

Fix It (4th and 5th grade Webelos) – All Home Assignment

1. Put a Fix It Toolbox together. Describe what each item in your toolbox can be used for.

2. Be ready. With the help of an adult in your family, do the following:

2a. Locate the electrical panel in your home. Determine if the electrical panel has fuses or breakers.

2b. Determine what heat source used to heat your home.

2c. Learn what you would do to shut off water for a sink, a toilet, a washing machine or a hot water heater. If there is a main shut off valve for your home, show where it is located.

3. Describe how to fix or make safe the following circumstances with help from an adult:

3a. A toilet is overflowing.

3b. The kitchen sink is clogged.

3c. A circuit breaker tripped, causing some of the lights to go out.

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4. Let's Fix It. Select and do eight of the following...

- 4a. Show how to change a light bulb in a lamp or fixture. Determine the type of light bulb and how to properly dispose of it.
- 4c. Tighten a loose handle or knob on a cabinet or a piece of furniture.
- 4e. Replace a furnace filter.
- 4f. Wash a car.
- 4g. Check the oil level and tire pressure in a car.
- 4n. Show how to replace a bulb in a tail light, turn signal, or parking light, or replace a headlight in a car.
- 4q. Change a battery in a smoke detector or a carbon monoxide detector and test its operation.
- 4u. Do a Fix It project agreed upon with your parent or guardian.

Project Family (4th and 5th grade Webelos) – All Home Assignment

1. Interview a grandparent, another family elder, or a family friend about what life was like when he or she was growing up. Share his or her story with another family member.
2. Talk with members of your family about your family name, history, traditions and culture.
 - 2a. Create a family tree of three generations, or make a poster that shows the origins of your ancestors.
 - 2b. Make a poster that shows the origins of your ancestors.
 - 2c. Choose a special celebration or holiday that some of your family members participate in and create either a poster, picture or photo slideshow of it.
3. Show your understanding of your duty to family by creating a chart listing the jobs that you and other family members have at home. Choose three of the jobs you are responsible for, and chart them for two weeks.
4. Select a job that belongs to another family member, and help that person complete it. Some examples would be to create a grocery shopping list for the week, to take out the trash for a week, to do the laundry for your family one time, to prepare meals for your family for one day, or to complete some yard work.
5. With the help of an adult, inspect your home and its surroundings. Make a list of hazards or security problems you find. Correct one problem you found and tell what you did.
- 6a. Hold a family meeting to plan an exciting family activity. The activity could include a family reunion, a family night, or a family outing.
- 6b. Create a list of community service or conservation projects that you and your family can do together, and present it to your family. Select one project, plan it, and complete it with your family.
